

**Brilliantina® Abelia**  
*Abelia x grandiflora 'KEYFLY'*

**Description:**

This attractive, compact, and colorful shrub has glossy green leaves with yellow-gold variegation; tidy, mounded habit and tubular white flowers make this shrub a welcome addition to smaller spaces

**Ornamental Features**

Brilliantina Abelia features dainty clusters of fragrant white trumpet-shaped flowers with shell pink overtones at the ends of the branches from early to mid summer. It has attractive yellow-variegated dark green foliage which emerges brick red in spring. The glossy oval leaves are highly ornamental and remain dark green throughout the winter. The dark red stems can be quite attractive.

**Landscape Attributes**

Brilliantina Abelia is a multi-stemmed evergreen shrub with a mounded form. Its average texture blends into the landscape, but can be balanced by one or two finer or coarser trees or shrubs for an effective composition.

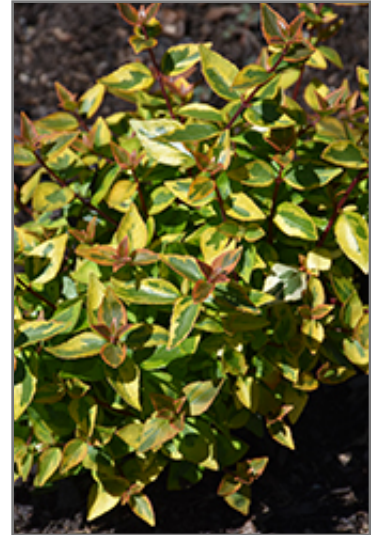
This shrub will require occasional maintenance and upkeep, and should only be pruned after flowering to avoid removing any of the current season's flowers. It is a good choice for attracting birds, bees and butterflies to your yard, but is not particularly attractive to deer who tend to leave it alone in favor of tastier treats. It has no significant negative characteristics.

Brilliantina Abelia is recommended for the following landscape applications;

- Mass Planting
- General Garden Use
- Container Planting

**Planting & Growing**

Brilliantina Abelia will grow to be about 30 inches tall at maturity, with a spread of 4 feet. It tends to fill out right to the ground and therefore doesn't necessarily require facer plants in front. It grows at a slow rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for approximately 30 years.

This shrub does best in full sun to partial shade. You may want to keep it away from hot, dry locations that receive direct afternoon sun or which get reflected sunlight, such as against the south side of a white wall. It does best in average to evenly moist conditions, but will not tolerate standing water. It is not particular as to soil type or pH. It is somewhat tolerant of urban pollution. This particular variety is an interspecific hybrid.

Brilliantina Abelia makes a fine choice for the outdoor landscape, but it is also well-suited for use in outdoor pots and containers. It can be used either as 'filler' or as a 'thriller' in the 'spiller-thriller-filler' container combination, depending on the height and form of the other plants used in the container planting. It is even sizeable enough that it can be grown alone in a suitable container. Note that when grown in a container, it may not perform exactly as indicated on the tag - this is to be expected. Also note that when growing plants in outdoor containers and baskets, they may require more frequent waterings than they would in the yard or garden.
